ANNEX 3 THE EVALUATION TEAM AND ITS WORK (NON-Edited)

The Evaluation Team consists of five experts comprising three international and two local experts. The experts were contracted through Impact Consulting Oy Ltd, which was selected in a tendering process by the MFA. The team consisted of Dr. Paula J. Williams (team leader), Ms. Raisa Venäläinen, Ms. Ruth Santisteban, Mr. Dwi R. Muhtaman, and Ms. Alice Nankya Ndidde. For Impact Consulting Oy Ltd, Ms. Merja Mäkelä provided quality assurance, in terms of discussing key issues with the team, providing feedback and internal review of documents prior to their submission to MFA.

For the assessment of the three NGO foundations, the three international consultants shared the work by each focusing on one of the foundations. Dr. Paula J. Williams, with a background in environmental, forestry, and development issues, undertook the assessment of the Siemenpuu Foundation. Ms. Raisa Venäläinen, with expertise in disability and development issues, examined the Abilis Foundation. Ms. Ruth Santisteban, a human rights and development expert, focused on the analysis of KIOS. The three international consultants worked together on the overall assessment of the NGO Foundations as a modality, and drafting most of the report. The evaluators participated in the Abilis Partnership meeting and Human Rights Seminar organized by the Centre for Human Rights of Persons with Disabilities (VIKE) in Helsinki from 19th to 24th May 2008. The Abilis facilitators and Review Board members were interviewed and a group discussion was held with representatives of eight Partner Organizations. They were supported in their efforts by the local consultants, who were active and vital contributors to the field missions in Indonesia and Uganda, and also contributed to the report. Mr. Dwi R. Muhtaman has considerable expertise in forestry, rural development and NGO issues in Indonesia. Ms. Alice Nankya Ndidde, a university professor, has significant experience in evaluation of development projects.

In **Indonesia**, the fieldwork was carried out between 16 and 24 July 2007, by Dr. Paula J. Williams and Mr. Dwi R. Muhtaman, and focused on Siemenpuu activities. The team carried out interviews in Jakarta, Bogor, Jogjakarta, and Pekanbaru, as well as field trips in central Java and on the Kampar Peninsula of Sumatra. They met with the Indonesian NGO activists who comprise the Indonesian Working Group (IWG) for Siemenpuu. The team visited several partner organizations that Siemenpuu had supported, including Forest Watch Indonesia, Telapak, the Indonesian Peasant's Union (SPI), *Aliansi Relawan untuk Penyelamatan Alam* (ARuPA, Volunteers Alliance for Saving Nature) and its local partners (the Koling Foundation, the local SPI chapter, and the village-level Sepkuba), and the JIKALAHARI NGO network in Sumatra. The Forest Watch Indonesia had been supported to develop a report on the national status of the forests. Telapak had received two grants for documentary films and advocacy work. SPI had received four grants to support their extension publications. ARuPA and its partners have been supported to work on community-based management of state forest lands. JIKALAHARI has received a series of grants, to raise awareness to stop illegal logging on the Kampar Peninsula, an important peat swamp area and thus significant carbon sink.

The team met with other resource persons knowledgeable about forestry, small grants, and NGO issues, including a Finnish forest researcher working at the Center for International Forestry Research (CIFOR), and a Programme Officer with UNDP's GEF Small Grant Programme and the previous EC-funded Small Grant Programme to Promote Tropical Forests (SGP-PTF), which had operated from 2004 to 2007. The team met colleagues at the Embassy of Finland in Jakarta, to discuss initial findings of the mission and also to discuss the Local Cooperation Fund, which in the future will include support for community forestry. After Dr. Williams' departure, Mr. Muhtaman conducted two additional interviews, with the Coordinator of the Community Alliance on Pulp and Paper Advocacy (CAPPA), on 4 September, and the Kehati Foundation Programme Coordinator managing a United Kingdom DFID forestry grant, with a small-grant component, on 8 September.

In Jogjakarta, the team also met with representatives of two organizations in Jogjakarta that had received grants from Abilis – *Dria Manuunggal* (The Institute for Research, Empowerment, and Development for People who are Differently Able), which had been supported to organize a workshop relating to development of the National Education Act, and *Sasana Integrasis Dan Advokasi Difabel* (SIGAB), which received funding to provide journalistic training and produce four publications on

disability issues. In Jakarta, the Evaluation Team met with Kalyanamitra, a women's rights organization, which had received a grant from KIOS in 2005-2006 to raise awareness regarding the UN Convention to Eliminate Discrimination against Women (CEDAW). This NGO is now being supported for other work on women's issues by a grant from the Finnish Embassy's Local Cooperation Funds.

A field mission to **Uganda** was carried out between 13 and 23 July 2007 by Ms. Raisa Venäläinen and Ms. Alice Nankya Ndidde. Interviews were conducted in Kampala, Kasese, and Fort Portal. Also the Beach Management Unit in Bulisa district was interviewed as well as disabled women groups in Mityana and Mobende. The team carried out interviews with four partner organizations of KIOS, with three partners of Siemenpuu and ten implementing organizations of Abilis grants, and with the Abilis Partner Organization, National Union of Disabled Persons of Uganda (NUDIPU). Both organizations with ongoing and completed projects were selected for interviews and one current applicant organization of KIOS.

The KIOS partners interviewed were the Foundation for Human Rights Initiative (FHRI), the East and Horn of Africa Human Rights Defenders Project (EHAHRDP), Action for Community Development – Uganda (ACODEV), and Association of Human Rights Organisations (AHURIO). The FHRI has received three grants from KIOS to strengthen its work at the grassroots level. The East and Horn of Africa Human Rights Defenders Project (EHAHRDP) has received two grants for conducting regional conference and strategy workshop and for institutional support and administrative costs. In Kasese, the field mission interviewed the staff, board members and paralegal advisors (beneficiaries) of the Action for Community Development – Uganda (ACODEV). This organization received first grant in May 2007 for institutional support and training of paralegals in Kasese District. In Fort Portal the mission interviewed the director of the Association of Human Rights Organisations (AHURIO), which has received funding in 2004 and 2005 to train paralegals in Rwenori Region. The management of Human Rights Network (HURINET), which has submitted its first application to KIOS, was interviewed. This organization is in the secretariat of the new Independent Human Rights Fund established in 2007. In terms of Siemenpuu grants examined in Uganda, the National Association of Professional Environmentalists (NAPE) has received four grants from Siemenpuu between period 2003 – 2007 for Geothermal workshop (2003-04), Publication on geothermal issues (2005), and Environmental Advocacy (2006-07) and for administering a meeting of the African Rivers network (2005-06). Uganda Fisheries and Fish Conservation Association (UFFCA) has received two grants for Developing Local Institutional Capacity for Fisheries Resource Management of Lake Albert - Uganda Fisheries and Fish Conservation 2002-05. In addition to the Project Coordinator, the field mission interviewed the Butyaba Beach Management Unit (UFFCA) in Bulisa district which benefited from this grant. In addition to these interviews in Uganda, the evaluators interviewed the manager of Sudewatch Organization during his visit to Finland in June. The mission found difficulties in tracking the Uganda Women's Welfare Association (UWOWA), which had received grants in 2004. It was still registered but not operational in its district.

The team selected for the interviews both ongoing and completed Abilis funded projects on the core thematic areas (income generation, advocacy and human rights) and projects run by disabled women. In Kampala, the Evaluation Team visited four organizations: Blind but Able (BBA), National Union of Women with Disabilities in Uganda (NUWODU), Young Deaf Women Association (YDWA), and the Uganda Parents with Deafblind Children Association. In Kasese and Fort Portal the following DPOs and project sites were visited: Kasese District Union of Persons with Disabilities (KADUPED), Kasese District Women with Disabilities (KADIWOD), Kyondo Development Foundation of Persons with Disabilities and Kisinja Sub county Tailoring Project. These organizations have completed the Abilis - funded income generation and skills training projects. On the way back to Kampala the team visited two disabled women's organizations and their beneficiaries in Mityana, and Mobende. Mityana Women Group has implemented a revolving loan project and Mobende group is implementing an advocacy project on Human Rights and HIV/AIDS.

The field mission had meetings with government officials from the Ministry of Education and Sports, the Ministry of Gender and Social Development and the Ministry of Health as well as the National Disability Council and the Kasese District Local Government. Also development partners in the fields of disability, development, and human rights - [UK Department for International Development](#), (DFID),

the Disabled Peoples Organisations - Denmark (DPOD), Action on Disability and Development (ADD) - were interviewed. Two meetings were held with the Abilis Partner Organization, NUDIPU. After the Uganda mission, the evaluator presented the key findings to KIOS and Abilis in Helsinki.
